Library Closure Announcement—UPDATED 3/29/20

On March 13, 2020, Governor Pritzker mandated that all schools in the state be closed beginning Tuesday, March 17 until further notice in an effort to curb the spread and impact of the COVID-19 coronavirus.

While normally we would invite our school-aged children to come to the library in the event of an emergency closing, this is not the best course of action when trying to curb a contagious disease. Because containment works best when all organizations participate, many libraries and other cultural organizations will be closed for the same duration.

Case-Halstead Public Library will be closed immediately beginning Monday, March 16 until further notice. This includes any events hosted by third-party organizations as well as all meeting rooms.

- Overdue fines will not accrue while the library is closed. Patrons are strongly encouraged to hang on to their library materials until further notice. Indeed fines and late charges are waived until further notice and even after the library reopens you will have several days to return your materials.

We are responsible as a community organization not only for protecting the spread of the virus, but also for the welfare of our library staff.
